



Programme for Mayors and Local Government Leaders

The Third United Nations World Conference on Disaster Reduction (WCDRR) will take place from 14 to 18 March in Sendai, Japan, where an agreement on a post-2015 framework for disaster risk reduction will be adopted. This framework will guide and support our collective efforts to build disaster-resilient nations, cities and communities. The World Conference is expected to be one of the largest-ever global gatherings of leaders and stakeholders committed to disaster risk reduction and resilience building.
